

## Oakley United FC – Code of Conduct

### **Youth Players Code of Conduct:**

- Play by the rules The rules of your club and the laws of the game.
- Never argue with a referee or other official Without these people you can't play football.
- Control your temper verbal abuse of officials and abusing other players doesn't help you enjoy or win any games and will not be tolerated by the club.
- Be a team player It's a team game, treat it that way.
- Treat all players as you would like to be treated fairly.
- Cooperate with your coach, the referees and team-mates.
- Play for your own enjoyment & to improve your skills.
- Don't use any remarks based on race, religion, gender or ability you'll let down your coach, team- mates and family if you do.
- Do not take part in any irresponsible, abusive, inappropriate or illegal behaviour, and
- Take time to thank those who help you take part whether they are your family, a coach or your teammates.

#### Players agree to:

- Inform your coach of any illness or injury you may have upon arrival for training or a match.
- Have fun and enjoy playing and training with your teammates.
- Listen to any instructions your coach is giving you and ask if you are unsure.
- Always make sure you arrive with the correct kit and that you have your boots, water and shin pads.
- Warm up thoroughly and when training or a game starts enjoy it and play with a smile on your face.
- Don't wear jewellery during training or a game.
- Don't chew gum during training or a game.
- Show a positive attitude and accept the coach's decisions.
- Encourage and support your team-mates.
- Display good behaviour at all times.
- Welcome new players to training and include them in all activities.

Any physical or verbal altercation will not be tolerated with offending parties being immediately ejected from the match or training session and Player suspended for a period of time which will be agreed by the club. Poor team behaviour may result in the removal of that team from any competition.



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## Parents' and supporters' code of conduct:

- Remember that you are there for the participants to enjoy the game.
- Encourage participation but don't force it.
- Teach that enjoying the game is more important than winning.
- Never ridicule mistakes or losses supporters are there to support not ridicule.
- Lead by example and respect all players, coaches, referees and spectators physical or verbal abuse will not be tolerated.
- Recognise all volunteers who are giving up their valuable time.
- Never publicly criticise referees raise any concerns you have with club officials in private.
- Don't use ugly remarks based on race, religion, gender or ability you'll let down your family and yourself if you do.

### Parents/guardians agree to:

- Accompany children to all training and games, until the children reach the point where they are playing 9-a-side football, and ensure their child is properly equipped i.e. boots, shin pads, water and sun cream where appropriate.
- Abide by the decisions and team selection of the coaches.
- Ensure that your child is prompt in attendance for training and matches and arrives at the time requested.
- Encourage all players in the team but don't coach.
- Be responsible for your child at all times.

Oakley United does have an exclusion policy which sets out the process and steps that Oakley United will follow when serious concerns are raised regarding the behaviour of a player or adult attending Oakley United training sessions or matches.
